

EXAMINATION PATTERN

The performance of students shall be evaluated in to 100 marks in to two semester end, each by way of continuous evaluation in the all subject excluding F.C.
Thus only the subject F.C. shall be evaluated in to two parts, internal assessment with 25% marks by way of continuous evaluation & by semester end assessment with 75% marks by conducting the theory examination.

ONLY FOR COMPUTER SCIENCE INTERNAL ASSESSMENT 25 MARKS :

- 1 Test 20 Marks
- Active participation in class & Overall conduct as a responsible student, mannerism and articulation & exhibit of leadership qualities in organizing related academic activities 05 Marks

SEMESTER END EXAMINATION - 100 MARKS

For F. C. (all faculties) 75 marks and internal assessment - 25 marks

duration :- These examinations shall be of 2.30 Hours.

For subject other than F. C. 100 m Duration - 2 Hrs.

- Since 2011-12 at present The University of Mumbai has adopted the Choice Based Semester and Grading System (CBSGS)
- All students will go through the Semester System
- Each year will be divided into Two Semesters with separate syllabus, examination and grading.
- Each Semester and will have 100 marks examination in all subject (except F.C.)
- Internal assessment is only for F.C. subject in all courses, as per above norms.
- Thus only F.C. subject will have 75 marks external examination of 2½ hours duration.
- The passing standard is 40% in all semester examinations.
- The First and Second year performance will be considered for Final year Degree results.

I FOR COURSES WITHOUT PRACTICALS FOR F.C. COURSE PAPER I & II

In case of a learner who is re- appearing for the Internal Examination, the examination will consist of one project of 25 marks.

- There is no internal assessment for learners of F.Y. & S.Y. classes for the practical, there is only external examination of 100 marks F.Y. Classes & 150 marks S.Y. Classes for each subject.

A.T.K.T. EXAM

- A student who has failed /was absent in the internal assessment (25 marks) can appear for the A.T.K.T. exam before semester end examination.
- A list of failed student will be displayed on the notice board by the concerned teacher.
- A.T.K.T. Examination will be conducted as per the University Time Table.
- An A.T.K.T. exam shall be conducted for practical examination for students who have failed the practical subjects or were absent on medical grounds or represented in sports, cultural etc.

B.A., B.Com & B.Sc. programmes shall carry 120 credits and students shall be graded on the 7 point ranking system as below :

ATKT RULES

- A learner who has failed in subject of semester I & III may appear for the ATKT exam conducted in April. Similarly those failing in Semester II & IV may appear for ATKT exams held in October.
- A learner of Arts or Commerce faculty who fails in a maximum of two papers per Semester is allowed to keep terms for the next academic year.
- A learner of the Science faculty who fails in a maximum of Three papers per Semester is allowed to keep terms for the next academic year.
- A learner of SY classes who has more than 900 maximum marks in each semester & fails in a maximum of 3 papers per semester is allowed to keep terms for the next academic year.
- Learners found adopting unfair means at the examinations, tests etc. will be dealt with as per the University Rules, MU Act 1994 and the provisions of Act No XXX1/1982 as the case may be.
- The facility of verification of Mark is available on application and payment of prescribed fees.
- A learner who has failed in semester I and semester III in any number of subjects will be allowed to appear in the October examination in the following year.
- A learner who has failed in semester II and semester IV in any number of subjects will be allowed to appear in Mar/April examination in the following year.
- A learner is allowed to keep terms in T.Y. Class if he / she has cleared F.Y. or S.Y. completely.

GRADING AND AVERAGE (GPA CALCULATION)

Semester Grade point Average (SGPA):- Each Semester grade point average is calculated by dividing the total of Product of grade (quality) point and course credit by sum of all course credits in a semester.

$$SGPI = \frac{ECG}{\Sigma C} \text{ for a semester.}$$

Where G is grade and C is credit for paper / course.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) for the Entire Course

$$CGPA = \frac{ECG}{\Sigma C} \text{ for all semesters taken together.}$$

NOTE :

- The total credits cover the core, elective, field work or extension activities, soft skills etc..
- GPA is calculated at the end of each term after grades have been processed and after any grade have been updated or changed.
- Same criteria are to be followed for Individual assignment / Quizzes / Test / Unit Test / Tutorials / Practical / Projects/ Seminar.
- The teacher should convert his/ her marking in to the quality points/ grade points and letter grade.

CIRCULAR NO.2

Exam Fees University Circular - "In partial modification to circulars CONCOL/Fee/134 of 2008 dated 23rd May, 2008 and CONCOL/Fee/292 of 2008 dated 7th July, 2008 the examinations fees to be charged to the students of the BA, B.Com. and the B.Sc. programs (Regular programs and excluding the self financing courses) admitted under the semester Based Credit & Grading System for Semester I and Semester II are modified".

University Circular No.UG/82 of 2013-2014 dt. 23rd December, 2013 AC7/6/2013

Item no.4.15 R.8654 ATKT rules for M.Sc. Program for Credit Based Semester & Grading System

- i) A learner shall be allowed to keep term for semester II irrespective of number of heads of failure in the semester I.
 - ii) A learner shall be allowed to take admission and to keep terms and appear for semester III irrespective of number of heads of failure in the semester I and II.
 - iii) A learner after attending semester III is allowed to go to semester IV.
 - iv) A learner shall be allowed to keep term and allowed to appear for semester IV irrespective of number of heads of failure in semester I,II and III. However the result of the semester IV shall be kept at abeyance until the learner passes each of the semester I, semester II, semester III.
- V) A learner will have to earn a minimum of 96 credits to pass the M.Sc. degree.
- VI) Those who fail in any course in any semester will have to clear the same in the examination conducted in the corresponding odd or even semester.
